## Message from the President


Dear Alumni and friends:

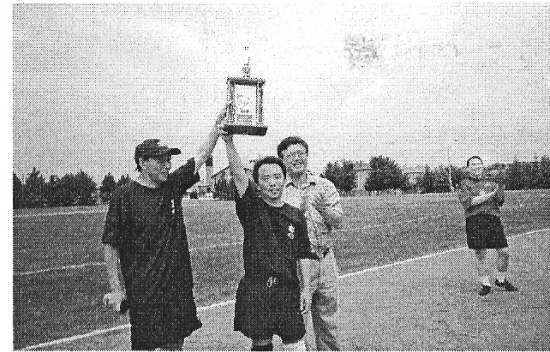

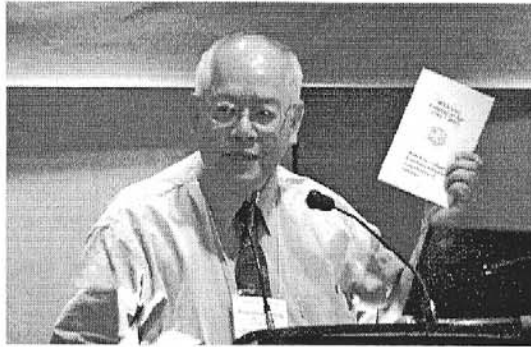

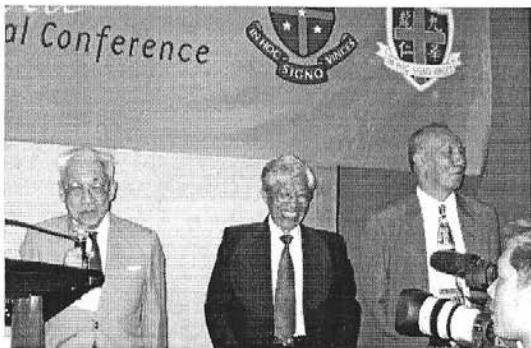

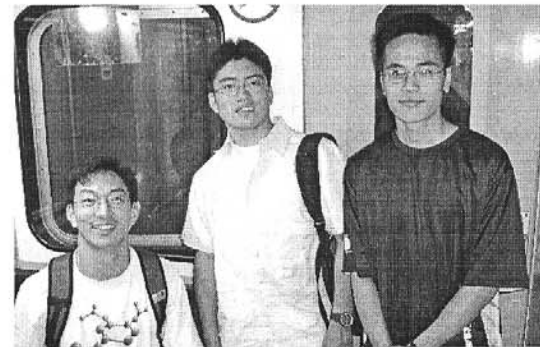

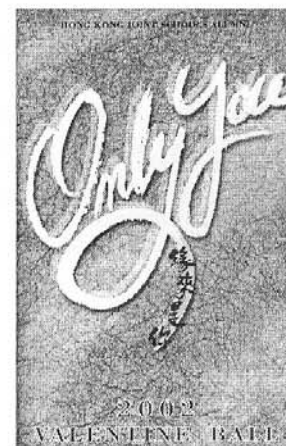

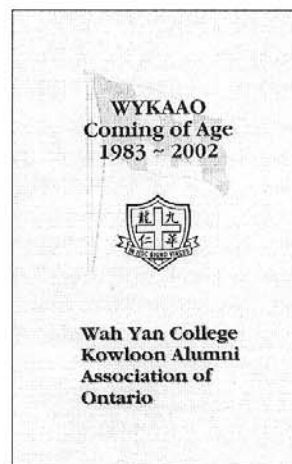

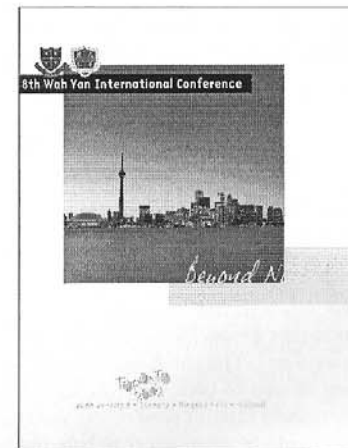

## 70 Years and a Century Apart

母校首屆畢業生曹國祥話舊陳年

1925年，入讀華仁分校第五班 [Form 2]，校址在砵蘭街與碧街東北角 [現為碧蘭大樓，梅江飯店舊址]。樓下為快餐店。第六，第七，第八班，[Form 1, Primary 6, Primary 5] 在二樓上課，樓梯在砵蘭街；第五班以上在三樓上課，樓梯在碧街。



當時西洋菜街是種菜地，還沒有上海街和佐敦道。大角咀有小山，由旺角去，要行田基。碧街與窩打老道為殮房，坊間傳聞，常有鬼魂出現。

1928年，新校舍建成，校長周清林。

1929年，我班，即第二班 [Form 5] 參加由香港大學主辦的 Junior Local 會考。全班共八人，全部及格。校長有意將首屆畢業生姓名刻在木板上以誌慶，惜未竟其事。同學李耀波其後任教母校數拾年。

是年秋季，每日乘天星輪渡海，步行上羅便臣道華仁正校就讀第一班預科，中途退學，就業中國海關。

## Waterloo Road Campus 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Fund Raising

2002 marked the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Waterloo Road campus of Wah Yan College, Kowloon. Over the past 50 years, we have made our marks in public examinations and many extracurricular activities and our graduates have also contributed greatly to society.
