


"I knew very little about the school days of my father. From what I could gather, he was apparently quite bright, placing first or second in class." - Paul Tsui's Memoir

Mr. Tsui Yan Sau was born in Ng Wah County in Guangdong Province, China. He attended St. Joseph's College and did well in the then public examinations, the Junior Local and the Cambridge Senior. He then completed the Teacher Training Course at the then Technical Institute. He taught for a short while at Ying Wa School for Boys and then went back to teach English at his native town at Meixian for a few years. Then he returned and took up a teaching post at St. Joseph's.

An educator with vision, he founded Wah Yan College, Hong Kong at 60 Hollywood Road on December 16, 1919. Shortly afterwards, he relocated the growing school to 2 Robinson Road. Under his leadership, Wah Yan College was admitted to the Hong Kong Government Grant School List in 1922. It became the first school administered by Chinese to be included in this prestigious group of schools. Mr. Tsui believed that "education is the best of all investments for one's future" as he often reminded his children and grandchildren - recalls grand daughter Angela Tsui Chan.

Then, Mr. Lim Hoy Lan was appointed the Principal and the school was even more successful and highly regarded by the public. Soon a Branch School was established at 70 Portland Street, Kowloon and Mr. Tsui became its first Principal.






1924 December Wah Yan Branch School was opened on 1st and 2nd floors of 70 Portland Street, at the northeast corner of Portland and Pitt, with entrance at Pitt Street. There were two classes of 24 boys.

1925	April	More rooms were rented to accommodate 141 boys on roll.	
	May	The general strike paralyzed business in Hong Kong. School was closed.	
	July	School was re-opened with 24 boys.	

1926 February Numbers had so greatly increased that more floors in other houses on Portland Street were rented.

September There were Class 8, Class 7, Class 6 (Form 1), Class 5 (Form 2) and Class 4 (Form 3) for the 227 boys on roll.

The school was located at the corner of Nelson Street and Tung Choi Street, facing a wide open space in front.

Mr. Chow Cheng Lam was the Principal.

Mr. Fatty Chow, as he was fondly remembered by his students, remained on staff until he retired in 1961. He taught English and Geography. He was universally admired and respected by his colleagues and students.

1929 First Graduating Class

The high academic standard of Wah Yan College, Kowloon had a perfect start. All eight students in the Graduating Class 2 (Form 5) passed the Junior Local Public Examination. Amongst the graduates, middle in the back row is Li Yiu Bor, who, after completing his Teacher Training, taught at Wah Yan Hong Kong (1931 ~ 41) and then Wah Yan Kowloon (1945 ~ 63). On his left is Tso Kwok Cheung, our live link to the early days at 70 Portland Street. Names of the early teachers were supplied by him.

1932	September	Mr. Lim Hoy Lan joined the staff after the Jesuits were asked to take over the management of Wah Yan College, Hong Kong.
1933	January	Mr. Lim became Principal. The school was operated independently of Wah Yan College, Hong Kong.
	February	Investiture of 11th Kowloon Boy Scouts Group took place. Scoutmaster was Mr. Chan Fook Hong, brother of Fr. Francis Chan, S.J.
		Mr. Lim was a teacher of teachers and built up a devoted and competent staff for the future growth of the school. A strict disciplinarian, he was nicknamed Tiger Lim. Mr. Lim Hoy Lan (1933 ~ 1952)
1941	September	Two Senior classes (Matriculation) were started at 103 Austin Road and students would no longer have to go to Wah Yan Hong Kong for their matriculation course.
	December	The Japanese invaded Hong Kong and the school was closed down. During the war the school was occupied by the Japanese.
1945		School reopened after the war.
1946		Fr. Patrick Toner, S.J., joined the administration as a 'Co-respondent'.





Seal of the Society of Jesus Members of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), in the eyes of the Chinese, are religious of selfless devotion, scholarly erudition and respect Chinese culture and tradition. The Irish Jesuits came to Hong Kong in 1926. They were asked to take over the management of Wah Yan College, Hong Kong in 1932 and then Wah Yan College, Kowloon in 1946.

1949

The Society of Jesus started to look for a site in Kowloon for Wah Yan College. Fr. Ryan, the Superior, Fr. Burke, Principal of Wah Yan College, Hong Kong and Fr. Toner ended their search on a hill overlooking Waterloo Road and some rice-fields.

1952 September 15 The 8:55 am bell ushered in a new era in the history of Wah Yan College, Kowloon.The Principal was Fr. Toner; the teaching staff was comprised of the Nelson Street and Wah Yan Hong Kong PM School teachers. Students from both schools amalgamated as one student body.

Fr. Toner was the Rector (1952 ~ 57). The Rev. Rector of the Jesuit community at Wah Yan Kowloon was also the Principal of the school.

Fr. Toner's vision : "The school is but an extension of

the home and the teacher's work is to supplement the education begun there by the parents...It shares the life, the Christian life, of many families. That is what I hope Wah Yan shall become." (1957). Fr. Toner retired to Ireland in 1963.

1957 ~ 60 Fr. Dargan left Ricci Hall where he was Warden to become Rector and Principal of our College. His piercing eyes would look right into you and invite you to open up and speak to him. He was always found listening to students around him at recess, before and after classes. His school captain in '58, George Zee, later became the first Jesuit priest from Wah Yan Kowloon.

One-third of the teaching staff was members of the Society of Jesus (S.J.). To promote better understanding between the religious and the lay members, Fr. Dargan held regular staff picnics. While he played bridge, he would encourage people to play mahjong at picnics. Both are mental exercises.

Fr. Farren

During his time, St. Ignatius Chapel was built. Together with its inscription, AD MAIOREM DEI GLORIAM, our chapel became a landmark on Waterloo Road.

Art and Music were encouraged. A solid foundation was laid for future growth.

1960 ~ 66 Fr. Farren became the Rector of the Jesuit Community of Wah Yan College, Kowloon and thus its Principal. He was kind and approachable. Students talked to him comfortably during free time. There was always an easy feeling when Fr. Farren was around.

"For losing yourself in work for others, you are finding your own true worth and in that only will you find true and lasting satisfaction," he advised his students on Speech Day in 1965.

During this period, Primary 6 classes were eliminated. 90% of Form 1 student in-take were sent by the Government. Fr. Farren would see that the remaining discretionary places were filled by brothers of the present students.

Fr. Farren left office after he had served two terms of Rector. He left for Wah Yan Hong Kong and then came back to teach until he retired completely in 1999, after 40 years of dedicated service to Wah Yan.

1966 ~ **78** This scholastic year saw the introduction of a new system in the government of the school. A Principal was nominated over the school and its affairs, and a Rector was appointed over the Community. This would ensure that when the Rector completed his term of office, the Principal would not be changed.

Fr. Derek Reid from Wah Yan Hong Kong became the Principal and Fr. James Tarpey, the Rector. Fr. Reid remained in the Principal's Office for twelve years.

In his time, he appointed an Assistant Principal, Mr. Anthony Ho, who served in this capacity from 1967 to 1977. This is a change from the old system of having a Jesuit as Prefect of Studies. Mr. Ho "was, in the eyes

of the students, strict, as he should be in maintaining discipline, and yet an easier member of the authority to approach, since he was a Chinese." (The Shield, 1968)

Fr. Reid believed in a system that would produce agents of social change. "Here in Wah Yan, we are making an honest effort to arouse social awareness in our students and to give

them a sense of belonging, and of being of value and importance to the community in which they live."

We witnessed the healthy growth of the Students Association which matured into self-government eventually.

East Building was completed in 1967 with the successful fund raising programme initiated by Fr. Chan, former Prefect of Studies.

During this time, Fr. Coghlan had been teacher, student counsellor and spiritual director for 8 years, the last 6 years of which he was also the Rector.

1978 ~ **91** During the 13 years as Principal at Wah Yan College, Kowloon, Fr. Deignan continued the building expansion programme to provide better study environment for the students.

When Fr. Deignan arrived, he introduced instrumental music into the school. The Western Orchestra was formed in 1981 and the Chinese Orchestra in 1983. These together with the Intermediate and Senior Choirs gave the students ample opportunities to carry on the strong music tradition at Wah Yan which has produced a few world-class professional musicians.

Fr. Deignan believed that, "A Jesuit school should be a training ground where students learn to become 'men for others.'" To move in this direction, he launched a staff development programme, "Dialogue on Teaching as a Service" in 1980.

Mr. Norman So, a student in Wah Yan Kowloon from 1959 to 1967, became the first lay member to become Principal in a Jesuit school in Hong Kong. He has the challenging position of keeping the Jesuit tradition in education with diminishing Jesuit involvement.

Fr. Zee became School Supervisor. He said, "The moral and religious education in schools must focus on helping students to really develop a sense of identity and find the meaning and mission of their lives."

When school term is over in July, we see the retirement of Mr. Francis Kong after having taught at school since 1961, Mr. Francis So since 1966, Mr. Paul Wong since 1978 and Mr. Wong Chung Him since 1988, a total of 103 years of teaching!
