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#### A Word about Me

I am Chung Wai Leung, Warren, the Principal designate of Wah Yan College, Kowloon. I am a past student, an old boy and I belong to the class of 79. Fr. Naylor was my F. 3 Form-teacher, Fr. Reid was my principal in my junior forms and Fr Deignan was my principal in my senior forms. Mr. Francis Kong taught me English and how to be a gentleman.
