Student Ambassador Scheme

The Wah Yan College, Kowloon Past Students' Association (WYKPSA) and Wah Yan College, Hong Kong Past Students' Association (WYHKPSA) have introduced the Student Ambassador Scheme since 1989-1990. Each year, the PSA selects an ambassador among the elected Outstanding Students. The ambassador plays an important role as being the bridge between alumni and current students; and representing students in PSA meetings, assisting in PSA events such as birthday lunch celebrations for Jesuit fathers, and reunions of different classes. Another duty is to visit overseas alumni chapters during the summer vacation.

Election of Outstanding Students 2016-2017

In November 2016, four F.5 students were elected as the Outstanding Students by all F.5 fellows to represent the whole form, namely Chin Hoi Fai of 5C, Kong Wai Man Verman of 5S, Wong Kin Kwan of 5Y and me. The PSA interviewed us individually, then announced the Student Ambassador in the Speech Day 2016. Being trusted by both F.5 students and the PSA with this important role is undoubtedly my greatest honour.

Visiting California, US

Thanks to the Wah Yan International Networking Committee and Mr. Michael Au's coordination, Piers Yeung Chut Chit, the Student Ambassador of WYHK and I visited the San Francisco Chapter and Southern California Chapter of Wah Yan Alumni Association. The trip lasted from 16 July 2017 (Sunday) to 25 July 2017 (Tuesday).

Wah Yan International Conference 2017

What's more fortunate is that I was invited to attend the 2017 Wah Yan International Conference (WYIC). WYIC was first launched in 1988 organized by WYHKPSA in Hong Kong. It was resolved to be held on a biennial basis, with the following objectives: to provide fellowship opportunities between local and overseas Wahyanites; to allow Wah Yan alumni all over the world to better understand the well-being of each other; to keep alumni informed about both WYK and WYHK; and to explore possible improvements on the global link networking.

The theme of WYIC 2017 is 'Setting the world on fire: Service as the fuel of Wahyanites' life journey'. It was held at the University of San Francisco (USF) - a premier Jesuit university located in San Francisco. USF's Jesuit Catholic identity was rooted in the vision and work of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuit order. The Conference was also co-hosted with the USF Ricci Institute for Chinese-Western Cultural History. Founded in 1984, it is a unique global resource for the study of Chinese-Western cultural exchange with a core focus on the social and cultural history of Christianity in China. The Ricci Institute strives to approach Chinese-Western interaction in the spirit of friendship and respect exemplified by the Institute's namesake, Matteo Ricci, the 16th-century Italian Jesuit who lived in China. The Institute promotes interdisciplinary academic research through publications, scholarship programs, and community outreach events. It also provides access to library and archival materials in Chinese and Western languages with a wide range of materials on the history of cultural interactions between China and the West.



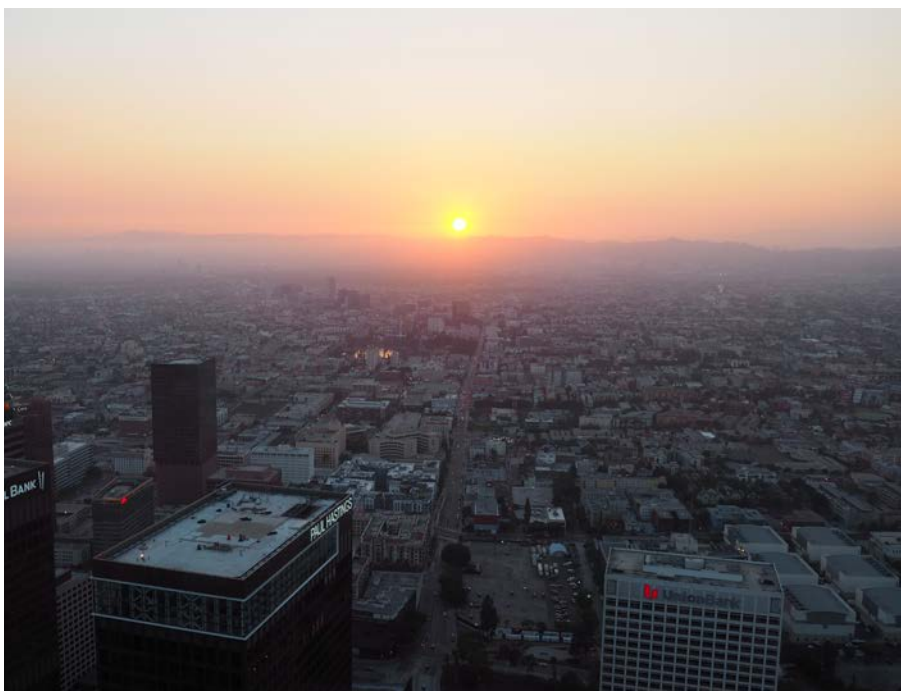
Day 1 - 16 July // Before the flight, Mr. Michael Au briefed us about our itinerary and arranged our airline tickets, which were sponsored by the Wah Yan PSAs. Mr. Eric Lai (WYK '97), Mr. Peter Tang, Mr. Philip Ching and Mr. Silas Chan (WYHKPSA) saw us off at the airport in the morning. The plane took off at 12:55 HKT, 16 July 2017.

After 13 hours of flight, we arrived at 11:10 local time, 16 July 2017 at Los Angeles International Airport. We were picked up by Mr. Jason Chan (WYK '93), the Chairman of Southern California Chapter, then headed to his house which would be our accommodation in Los Angeles. Jason took us to walk around his spacious apartment, consisting a mini-garden in the backyard. The environment was extremely conformable without a feeling of stress.



At night, we were pleased to have dinner with a number of overseas alumni at the NBC Seafood Restaurant for Chinese cuisine. I was grateful to meet Dr Ian Yip, Mr. Wai-Ming Li, Mr. Isaac Li, Mr. Burton Tsang, Mr. Donald Lee, Mr. James Ho, Mr. Raymond Wong and Mr. Philip. It was a precious opportunity for us to chat with the seniors and exchange our ideas on secondary school lives and tertiary education. I shared a lot of current updates in Wah Yan with them. They showed the warmest welcome and made me anticipate for the coming journey.

Day 2 - 17 July // Mr. Raymond Wong (WYK '12) brought Piers and me to the Universal Studios Hollywood after having a Western brunch. It was the first time for me to go to such a fascinating theme park other than the Ocean Park and Hong Kong Disneyland. The rides and attractions were unique and thrilling with different movie themes. Fusing 3D HD media and flight simulation technology, these games brought me brand new experiences. It also recalled our memories on numerous classical and famous films and cartoons. Indeed, it was the most exhilarating day filled with joy and excitement.



After an exhausting day at the Studios, we went to the California's tallest open-air observation deck - OUE Skyspace in the evening. The view of Los Angeles was unobstructed in the two open-air observation terraces, showcasing stunning scenic landscapes. We also experienced the heart-pounding adventure in the transparent 'Skyslide'. We were astonished when admiring the dynamic natural changes and appearance of the golden sunset in Skyspace. To conclude the day, Raymond brought us to the LA Koreatown and enjoyed Korean Barbecue with Mr. Philip Lee (WYK '14).

Day 3 - 18 July // The visit to J. Paul Getty Museum started another day. It housed European paintings, drawings, sculpture, illuminated manuscripts, decorative arts, and photography from its beginnings to the present, which have been gathered internationally. It made me place myself in the medieval age. One of the most impressive artworks was the Self-Portrait, Yawning by a French painter Joseph Ducreux in 1883. It was a hilarious portraiture in combination with the radical informality of pose. You may not have considered the possibility that some natural movements or gestures could be transformed into brilliant masterpieces, but that was what the painter did and impressed a number of viewers. Professor Tong was an experienced teacher in both Wah Yan colleges, while Raymond is currently a postdoctoral researcher at the University. Professor Tong raised some inspiring questions such as the 'Secretary Problem' and asked for our opinions on some social issues.

He also shared a lot of interesting news and secrets about Wah Yan. Followed by that, we had a campus tour guided by the University's students, introducing the history and different departments of the school.



Approaching to the evening, we had a walk on Hollywood Boulevard accompanied by Hubert Young (WYHK '94) and James Young (WYHK '97). Hubert used to be a racing driver and James is a Hip-hop enthusiast. They shared many wonderful experiences in their career and how they immersed themselves in the Western culture. They brought us to the Griffith Observatory after having some burgers and fries, where an extract of movie 'La La Land' took place. A series of astronomy exhibition was showcased and the nightscape of Los Angeles was also splendid.

Day 4 - 19 July // Another morning began with a full American breakfast in the Russell's - a local diner in Old Town Pasadena, led by Mr. Isaac Li (WYK '98). We also walked along the streets and lanes, tasted some typical food and drinks including organic fruit bought in a branch of Whole Foods Market and Cold Brewing from Peet's Coffee. The journey in Los Angeles nearly drew to a close, and we headed to another half of our tour - visiting San Francisco Bay Area.

We took the flight of a domestic airline and arrived the San Francisco International Airport at 15:30 local time. After meeting Mr. Ambrose Leung (WYK '02), the Chairman of Wah Yan Alumni Association, San Francisco Bay Area Chapter, he drove us to Holiday Day Express in Union Square to and set down our luggage. We had dinner at Ambrose's home and we got back to the hotel and took some rest.

Day 5 - 20 July // The first full day in San Francisco was tightly-scheduled. In the morning, we visited Stanford University with Dr. Leung Kin Ping who taught in WYK decades ago, Mr. Lobo Wong, Mr. Alex Wong, Mr. Lee Kwok Keung and his spouse, and Kelvin Lee (5W). As one of the world's leading institutes, it has a tremendous and well-equipped campus. Stanford Memorial Church, which is the most representing building of the university, was filled with stunning Renaissance art and architecture. I could totally feel the positive learning atmosphere and imagine the enjoyable study at school.

Our next destination was Google Headquarters in Mountain View - the origin of advanced information technology. After trying the staff meal buffet, we walked around the office led by Mr. Martin Law, Mr. Martin Ma and Mr. Steven Tung (WYHK), who were currently working for the corporation. Google offered a lot of welfare and supporting facilities such as the diner, coffee shop and bicycles for employees in the Googleplex. The enterprise highly emphasizes environmental-friendly and technological-based operations. Modern designs and items could be easily found and observed. The visit was inspiring and motivating which truly widened my horizon.

In the evening, we were given some time to explore the downtown of San Francisco on our own from Union Square. We had a walk in Chinatown, which is one of the oldest and most established Chinatowns in North America. We took pictures in front of the gateway, under the plaque written with the Chinese words 'Tian Xia Wei Gung' (天下為公). A variety of traditional and culture decorative items were displayed along the streets. After that, we took the cable car and had a 15-minute walk to San Francisco Museum of Modern Art. Each floor of the museum was characterized by different themes, hitting humans' greatest sensations and feelings with contemporary art. It summed up the fruitful day.



Day 6 - 21 July // After having some Hong Kong stylish food in a restaurant, we took BART (Bay Area Rapid Transit) to Downtown Berkeley. Mr. Herman Chan (WYK '10) led us for a campus tour together with Mr. Lobo Wong's and Mr. Kwok Keung Lee's family. We visited physics and research laboratories, libraries, the Business Faculty and the Valley Life Sciences Building. The most impressive sight must be the tremendous Tyrannosaurus skeleton located in the Museum of Palaeontology. Furthermore, we went to the Free Speech Movement Café in the campus, commemorating this massive student protest which aimed at advocating students' rights.

In the afternoon, we took a long ride to Golden Gate Bridge. There were a lot of visitors and tourists at vista point of this most significant and iconic landmark of San Francisco. After taking several photos, we headed to the Xavier Auditorium in Fromm Hall, USF for checking-in and helping with the welcome reception of WYIC 2017. After greetings, we had an unofficial dinner with fathers, principals, teachers and some alumni who were participating in the Conference.



Day 7 - 22 July // WYIC began with the welcoming speeches by Mr. Gordon Leung (WYK '97) - Chairman of Organizing Committee and Rev. Fr. Timothy Godfrey, S.J. - USF Trustee and Rector of USF Jesuit Community, followed by the opening prayer and speech by our school supervisor Rev. Fr. Stephen Chow, S.J. (WYHK '77). After that, Rev. Fr. Antoni Ucerler, S.J., who is the Director and Associate Professor at the Ricci Institute for Chinese-Western Cultural History, told us the biography of Matteo Ricci and history of Jesuit Education with the theme 'Engaging China and the World as "Men for Others"'. Dr. Xiaoxin Wu shared the founding of the USF Ricci Institute with us and led all participants to a center visit. The keynote speech was presented by our honourable guest speaker, Ms. Cassandra Staff, COO of Miller Center for Social Entrepreneurship, Santa Clara University on "Social Entrepreneurship: Values in Action". The morning session with various content and knowledge marked a brilliant beginning of the Conference.

In the afternoon session, Educational Psychologist Dr. Matthew Chu (WYK '89) presented on 'The Romance of Wah Yan'. He shared some of his teaching experiences, as well as his interactions with Wahyanites from different generations. He recalled that once a F.2 student gave him a handmade card on his birthday. The student reminded Dr. Chu that he must spend the night and enjoy a meal with his family members, as his parents did not usually stay with him. Dr Chu said he was touched with this greatest warmth. Also, he showed us a video of a social experiment in WYHK: a small amount of money was placed on the counter of tuck shop. Each student could take the money to buy some snacks, and then place another amount of money and the changes on the counter. After a week, there was a double of the original amount left. He thought this proved Wahyanites are generous, caring, and 'romantic' in nature.

The most highlighted and large-scaled event came in the evening - Gala Dinner. I set up a booth at reception selling products from WYKPSA and WYK Students' Association, including car badges, wine openers, cufflinks, wallets, ties, folders, and porcelain cups. A video conference was conducted with Rev. Fr. Alfred Deignan S.J. and Rev. Fr. Sean Coghlan S. J. during the dinner. After the speech-delivering and photo-taking sessions, we were invited to be on stage and shared our feelings towards the Student Ambassador Tour and Wah Yan. The dinner ended in rounds of applause after the climax of alumni's performances.





Day 8 - 23 July // The Sunday morning was started with an opening mass, held in Xavier Auditorium of USF. The Conference resumed after the breakfast session. It came with the reports from both Wah Yans. Dr So Ying Lun, the principal of WYHK, reported the certain updates of school and mentioned about the DSS (Direct Subsidy Scheme) Consultation. Our principal, Mr. Chung Wai Leung Warren, played a video concluding the various campus life in WYK, and revealed some upcoming projects and renovations. Both sessions were followed by a Q&A Session in order to let overseas alumni voice their opinions and have a clearer understanding. Furthermore, there were reports from different alumni chapters. Last but not least, brief planning of the next WYIC was discussed, which would probably be held in Hong Kong in the academic year of 2019-2010, celebrating the 100th anniversary of WYHK in the meantime. The Conference officially ended in the closing ceremony.

It was also the last day of our enjoyable tour. After checking out, Elvis Siu (WYK '08) led us to Palace of Fine Arts in the Marina District. We took some stylish photos and admired the wonderful scenery along the pond. Then, we headed to the Lombard Street - the most curved road in the world - with Eric Chow (WYHK '02) and Ian Chiu (WYHK '17). Eric also brought us to the well-known Fisherman's Wharf, watching the sunbathing and barking sea lions at the pier. He also shared some interesting anecdotes about his life in San Francisco. The weather was extremely cold with freezing wind, especially when we were walking along the coastal site. Finally, we went to a hot pot restaurant for our 'last supper' of the trip. The boiling water and delicious food made me warm and full, yet the cordial hospitality they accorded us was even warmer. It summarised our tour in the best way.

They drove us to the San Francisco International Airport and saw us off. The plane took off at 00:50 local time on 24 July 2017, and arrived Hong Kong at 06:10 HKT, 25 July 2017.

A fterthoughts

First and foremost, I would like to express my greatest gratitude to the Past Students' Association of both Wah Yan for selecting me as the Student Ambassador and sponsoring for the tour, as well as the Southern California and San Francisco Bay Area Chapters of Wah Yan Alumni Association for hosting us throughout the tour. Needless to say, I would also like to thank the joint efforts of the Wah Yan International Networking Committee and overseas alumni.

Being the Student Ambassador, I am obliged to connect current students and alumni both locally and globally. It is a precious opportunity for me to learn from others in the community. The role is especially significant to the ongoing development of our school and to build the school as a cohesive unit. It is also my honour and privilege to be a part of the WYIC 2017 and to share my stories with my seniors.

This tour has definitely made me more open-minded and helped me step out of my comfort zone. Everything in California is quite different from Hong Kong. There are not many skyscrapers, crowded subways and tiring lives. What impressed me the most is that, even though some alumni do not stay in their home countries, they are still bonded strongly and care about their alma mater. Wahyanites are always the closest family members, no matter where we are.

I believe 'Wahyanites' is not only a title, but a pride to all of us.

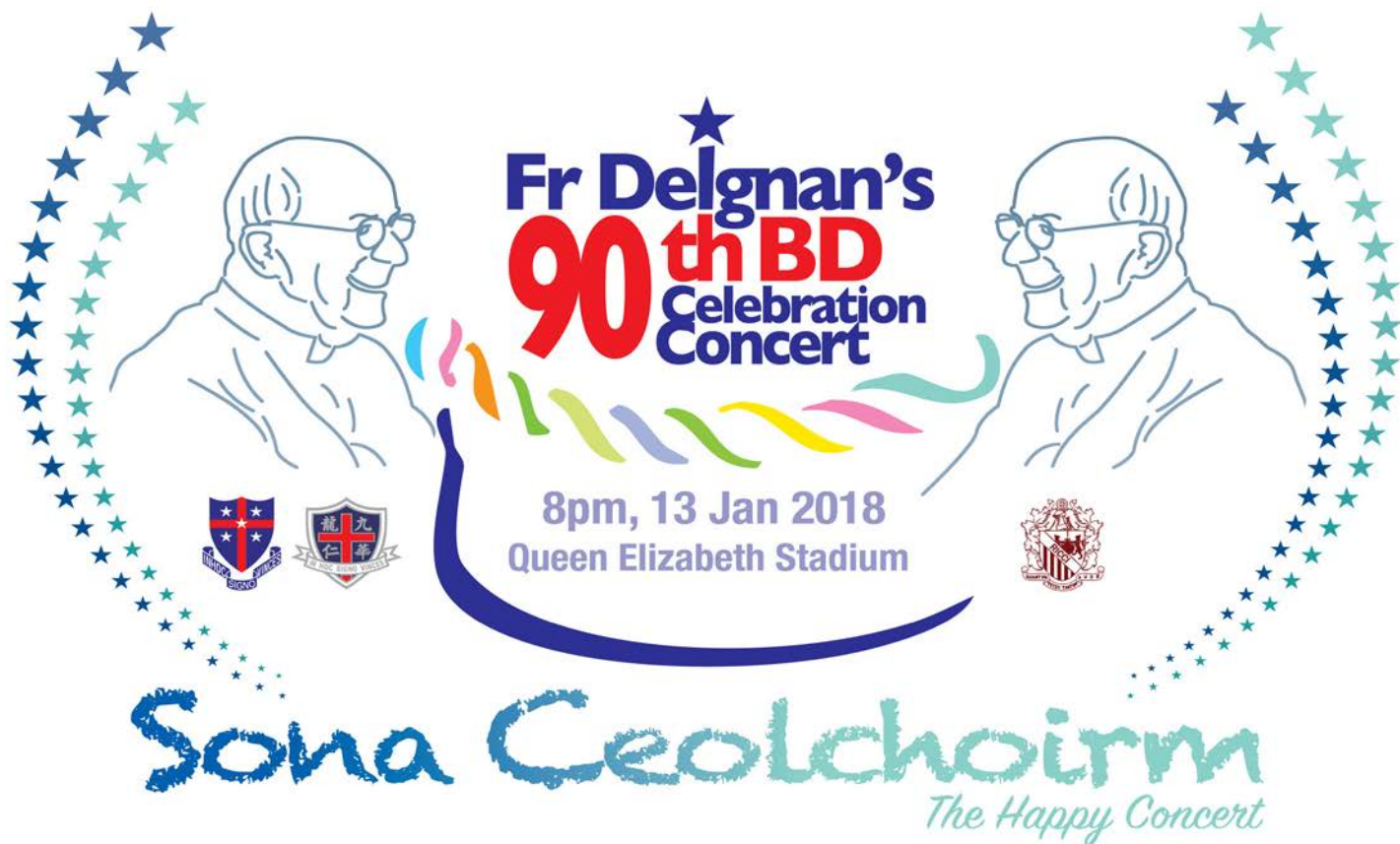
Apart from giving birthday presents to Fathers and had lunch together, the WYKPSA also arranged a magic show during the lunch for Fathers' enjoyment.

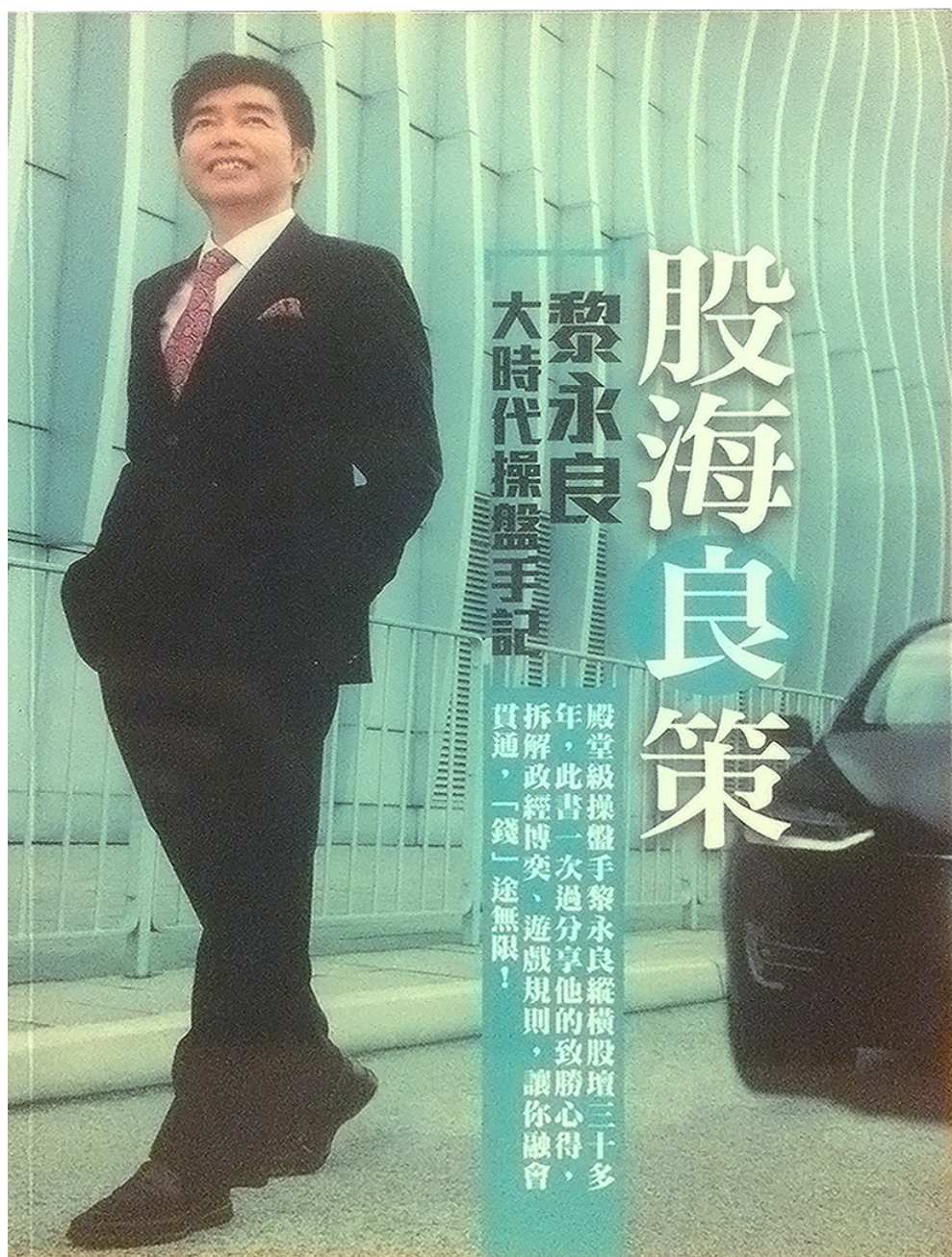
